



MIAMI LAKES, Fla. (December 16, 2024)

Former sportscaster Don Criqui has been named the 2024 recipient of the Edwin Pope Orange Bowl Vanguard Media Award, which annually honors a member of the sports media who has made significant contributions to college football and impacted the Orange Bowl and/or the South Florida community.

Don Criqui is an American sportscaster with a remarkable career spanning over 47 years, beginning in 1967. He holds the record for the longest-tenured NFL broadcaster in U.S. television history, calling NFL games from 1967 to 2013 on NBC and CBS. Criqui covered 14 Orange Bowl games during his career, including several that determined the college football national champions. Most notably, he covered the 1984 Orange Bowl between undefeated Nebraska and Miami, where Miami upset Nebraska to win its first national championship, ending Tom Osborne's Cornhusker's 22-game winning streak.

From 2006 to 2017, Criqui was the football radio play-by-play voice for his alma mater, Notre Dame. He has also covered a wide range of sports, including the NBA, NHL, and major events like the Summer Olympics. Criqui was awarded the prestigious Pete Rozelle Radio-Television Award from the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2003. He joins an illustrious group of previous winners of the Edwin Pope Orange Bowl Vanguard Media Award, including Jim Mandich, Bernie Rosen, Hank Goldberg, Chris Fowler, Ivan Maisel, Tony Segreto, Greg Cote, and of course, Edwin Pope. He is a devoted family man, with four sons, one daughter, and fifteen grandchildren.

Criqui will be honored in an on-field ceremony at the 2025 College Football Playoff Semifinal at the Capital One Orange Bowl on January 9, 2025, at Hard Rock Stadium in the first year of the 12team playoff.

"This year, Shayne has been selected as the recipient of this prestigious award."



Shayne is a caddie at SLGC, nephew to member, Dennis Leddy, and son of former members, Paul and Kathy Leddy.

"As I read through the criteria for the award, he was the perfect fit," said Norwich University Head Football Coach Bill Russell. Leddy not only leads the team with 78 total tackles, but has been a key leader across his four years in Northfield. It's an honor the Spring Lake, NJ, native was surprised to get, but he's excited to accept on the behalf of the entire team.

"I am honored to be selected for the 2024 Defender of the Nation Award. This award really recognizes my family, my classmates at Norwich, my teammates, and the coaching staff for all the hard work and sacrifices we have made together. I'm proud to have achieved the things I have, and I could not have accomplished anything without the support of my friends and family. This award further inspires me to achieve great things for Norwich Football and our nation's Army" said Leddy.

Leddy was joined by Coach Bill Russell and Norwich University Athletic Director, Ed Hockenbury, where he accepted the award in Charlotte, North Carolina, on December 9th.

CHEF'S CORNER BRENDAN ARENTH, EXECUTIVE CHEF



Behind the Scenes in the Spring Lake Golf Club Kitchen

any people ask me what's my favorite thing to cook? or what's your specialty? I always respond with the same answer -- that I can't really pick and that the greatest accomplishment as a cook or chef is to be well rounded and be able to cook many different things in different situations and atmospheres which are often chaotic, high pressure, and not to mention very hot, especially in the summer months.

Now as we are in the off-season, this is a great time for menu planning, cleaning, organization, and brainstorming exciting and fresh new ideas to bring to the menus, golf outings and private member events and celebrations for this upcoming season.

When I host the cooking classes, many of the members are very excited to see the kitchen in action and are amazed that although it is a large kitchen, it is not oversized by any means, and I get asked questions like how do you make and prepare a la carte dining for three hundred and fifty members and guests at the same time as a wedding for three hundred people on the same day?

The answer is at Spring Lake Golf Club, in peak season, it is not uncommon for us to serve over 1000 meals in one day between breakfast, lunch, and dinner between both kitchens, a la carte, golf events and banquets. To feed this many people, we rely on a kitchen brigade system. I have a Sous Chef, and a Chef De Cuisine. Here, the Sous Chef works with the catering department and is responsible for running the private member events that are booked for the day. In the a la carte kitchen, the Chef de Cuisine, works alongside a very talented group of culinarians that each specialize in a certain area. This is structured by the stations - Garde Manager, Grill, Sauté Middle and the Expediter. I also never forget the kitchen workers and dishwashers that are just as important as anyone producing food, because without them we cannot run effectively. They are the true heroes of the kitchen in keeping the kitchen clean. Washing the dishes and pots stacked, and taking out all the garbage is a tough and often unappreciated job.

Our banquet kitchen produces thousands of meals per week in season. This is achieved by strict organization, timing, and experience. At Spring Lake Golf Club, we have a very dedicated staff that spend very long days in the summer and holiday months to ensure that the membership and their guests have a terrific experience and meal to remember.

I am looking forward to another great season ahead!

WHAT'S HOT FOR 2025!

know a ton of our members and families are excited to throw on their skis and hit the slopes, but we can't forget about the golf technology that is about to launch in the upcoming weeks. My staff and I will attend the PGA Merchandise Show at the end of January, but I want to give you a peak into the equipment world from the eyes of the Club Pro. As this year comes to a close, we've gotten quite a few questions surrounding new equipment for the 2025 season. We're here to offer up a little glimpse into what we anticipate will be hot next year.

Some of the industry equipment leaders are still producing clubs on a two-year lifecycles; such as Titleist and Ping. Ping is at the end of their G430 lifecycle, but Titleist will continue to deliver the industry's "fastest" metal woods for another year.... the GT line. The Titleist drivers have been the most played

club on tour for the last five years and counting, and with that, they introduced the GT line which is the most advanced and best-performing by far. The GT line has three drivers in the quiver including the GT2, GT3, and GT4. The GT2 is designed for speed and forgiveness across the face with a higher MOI setup. The GT3 is designed for fine-tuned speed and control while maximizing speed and flight. Lastly, the GT4 is a low-spin, smaller-head driver to eliminate excessive spin and deliver a lower penetrating flight.



Now let's talk about the new guys to the party. In 2025, three of the "big dogs" in Taylor Made, Ping and Callaway will bring their latest technology to the market. While specific details will begin to emerge in early January, let's outline what we do know about the upcoming offerings.

Taylor Made will look to follow up its extremely successful Qi10 line with the new Qi35. As in 2024, they'll offer a Core Qi35 Model, a player's model in the Qi35 LS (Low Spin), and what will likely be the most forgiving driver on the market, the Qi35 Max. With the success of the Qi10, we expect the Qi35 to continue that trend. The standard Qi35, shown below, has a Speed Pocket behind the leading edge, a 3-gram weight that we can see, and according to the USGA notes, there is a second weight port in the back of the sole. The Qi35 LS, which undoubtedly is a low-spin version, has two 3-gram weights in the front of the head and a third weight in the back.

The Qi35 Max has a single, large weight on the back of the head and in small



type, the words "10 kg-cm²" can be seen in the heel area. Last season, TaylorMade offered its first driver that has a combined moment of inertia over 10,000 g-cm², the Qi10 Max, so we can assume this driver will be another extreme-MOI offering for golfers who struggle to find the center of the face on tee shots.

PING is set to launch its G440 series in early 2025, introducing updates to their popular G430 lineup. The G440

driver range includes three models: the G440 MAX, LST (Low Spin Technology), and SFT (Straight Flight Technology). Each driver features a lightweight Carbon Fly Wrap crown and an adjustable weight system to customize ball flight.

In the past, Max drivers from Ping have been made to maximize distance and forgiveness. In the photo, we can clearly see a three-position sliding tungsten weight with Draw and Fade settings. CarbonFly Wrap is also printed on the toe; CarbonFly Wrap is a carbon fiber crown design that extends into the heel and toe that Ping has used in some recent drivers. We can also see the words "Forged Face" written on the leading edge.

The G440 LST also has a three-position sliding tungsten weight, but LST has stood for low-spin technology in the past, so this driver is likely a model made for heavy hitters who need a spin-killing driver off the tee.

The G440 SFT appears to have been made for golfers who slice. It has a two-position weight system in the back — Draw and Draw+ — and in the past, SFT has stood for straight-flight technology.



Rounding out the trifecta, Callaway will release their Elyte line in 2025. The Elyte driver range, like 2024, will encompass four separate models in hopes



of fitting a wider range of golfers with all drivers utilizing Callaway's patented AI technology. Those models are the core Elyte, player's model Elyte Triple Diamond and the extremely forgiving Elyte X and Elyte Max Fast.

The standard Elyte (shown left) has a moveable weight that allows players and fitters to create a draw or fade bias, while the Max has a two-setting weight that can be moved into a Neutral or Draw+ setting. The Max Fast does not appear to have a moveable weight.

In the past, Triple Diamond products were low-spin products made for pros and accomplished golfers, while Max Fast clubs are designed with lighter components for slower-swinging players. The Elyte Max, with two draw settings, is undoubtedly a club designed for golfers who battle a slice.

While all four drivers clearly have an adjustable hosel, it is hard to tell many other things from the USGA images, however, the notes state that the words "Ai 10X Face" are printed on the hitting area. In the past, Ai has stood for a hitting area that was designed using artificial intelligence.

The 2025 golf season definitely looks like it's going to be a standout year for golf equipment and the Professional Staff has already locked in Fitting Days to start next season. We promise to have multiple demo days for each vendor to fit in everyone's busy schedule while delivering the best technology to everyone. We're excited about the new offerings and look forward to getting everyone dialed in for the 2025 golf season.

GREENS AND GROUNDS

hat an interesting winter we have had so far this year. We were spoiled by some great weather late into November, then suddenly the cold and snow began to set in, a pretty stark contrast to the prior few mild winters. We are doing everything we can to keep the golf course open and available as much as possible without subjecting it to damage. At times, you may encounter temporary greens, which are typically only utilized when the course is undergoing a thawing pattern, causing the greens to be overly wet in the top couple of inches. Also, you may have noticed us cut in some areas in the rough surrounding tee boxes to be utilized as temporary tees. These areas will help limit divots on the tees during the winter where they cannot heal. This should provide a marked improvement this spring in the tee box conditions.

On the golf course we have been heavily involved in our annual cleanup of the leaves, brush, and undergrowth areas. We have also spent a lot of time re-edging the bunkers, addressing sand issues, and preparing them for the 2025 season. We will begin some tree work shortly; this year there are not many areas prescribed to be taken down and we will focus our efforts on dead or failing trees around the property. We have also made all our fall and winter chemical and fertilizer applications in preparation for a fantastic 2025 golf season.

Off the golf course, things are moving very well at the Turf Care Facility. There have been minimal delays and construction is moving along well. The anticipation is still to be in and utilizing the space by May 1st.

With that being said, we are very excited to break ground on the new Short Game Practice Facility, following our move back to the New Turf Care Facility. Mottin Golf and Tripp Davis will be on site to begin rebuilding the facility. This facility will vastly improve our current practice situation and provide a facility with ample room for multiple members to utilize, improve conditions, and practice more shots people encounter on the golf course.


